Summer 2012 Leadership/Safety in a Camp Environment

College students who have completed their freshman year in good standing at accredited colleges are eligible to enter the specialized three elective credit Lackawanna College Leadership/Safety in a Camp Environment offered at selected camps who have Certified Camp Safety Directors or students who have completed at least two courses.

Gene Ezersky Camp Safety College

The Gene Ezersky Camp Safety College founded by Henry M. Skier was created as a specialized safety program offering course work to promote and enhance safe summer camp environments. Now in its eleventh academic year, with original affiliation with Mercy College in New York State and present affiliation with Lackawanna College, the college has graduated its tenth class of Certified Camp Safety Directors. Students in the Safety College are instructed by at least Master's Degree level instructors, many of whom are adjuncts at accredited colleges and universities throughout the United States. The curriculum focus is on the following seven areas of instruction:



College Curriculum for Certification of Camp Safety Directors

- ◆ Facilities & Grounds Management
- ◆ Transportation & Travel Supervision
- ◆ Emergency Preparation, Planning and security Issues
- ◆ Health & Sanitation
- ◆ Leadership Issues & Recommended Solutions
- ◆ Kitchen & Food Services
- ◆ Latest Activity Programs & Safety Issues



Many Owner/Directors of camps have chosen to obtain this specialized certification primarily because of their concern for the safety of campers and staff. Assistant directors or full time staff with a three to five year commitment to camping have also been accepted for this program. Once certified, Camp Safety Directors become Field Supervisors for the Safety College. Focused on safety as their primary concern at day and residential camp sites, their education and training becomes invaluable assistance to the overall management and strategic planning at camps.

Memo to College Advisors

The college student currently enrolled in your institution will be employed at a summer camp offering the Lackawanna College Leadership/Safety in a Camp Environment for Summer 2012. This student is seeking advanced permission from you for approval of three elective transferable credits at the satisfactory completion of the program as described below:

Course Requirements

- ◆ Three safety goals are to be established by the student and the Camp Safety Director.
- ◆ Five safety articles from an assigned bibliography of safety magazines/or journals must be read, analyzed, and summarized.
- ◆ Attendance at regularly scheduled supervisory meetings.

- ◆ A paper of at least 1000 words must be completed on the following topic:

"The Care and Safety of Other People's Children at Camp."

- ◆ Successful completion of summer employment.
